Families are at the centre of our work. We care for children, support them individually and offer families a meeting place, comprehensive advice and education. Both the integration of immigrant families and supporting families with children who have special needs are important to us. We also offer eight special educational places and five integrative places in our facility.

Advice and support for children and families

The Marie Juchacz Family Centre has a good network in the district. By involving other institutions, it guarantees families a wide range of experts to support them with a wide variety of questions and problems. Qualified and friendly staff will help you find the right contact person.

Family education and educational partnership

The Family Centre offers a wide range of activities for all families and the social room is open to parents. Our services promote communication with each other and with our on-site experts. Recognising and developing your own strengths and resources is the basis of an equal educational partnership.

The AWO educational guidance centres and the AWO community centres provide competent support. They are reliable local partners.

Daycare

The family centre provides parents with information about various forms of childcare, especially for children under three, and helps them find qualified childcare providers.

What we offer in terms of childcare

- 83 places
- 10 children under three years old
- children with additional support needs
- Groups
 - One T1 group (age 2 to school age)
 - Two T3 groups (age 3 to school age)

- Up to 47.5 hours of daycare a week
- Flexible drop-off and pick-up times
- Generally closed for up to 20 days per year
